Introduction

Lagos

One of the 36 states of Nigeria with 57 LGAs

Size – About 3577 Sq. Km (0.39% of Nigeria's 923,773 Sq. Km)

Population of about 22 million people – High population Density: 4,193 persons/Sq. Km

- Commercial hub of Nigeria & the West African sub-region
- o The generation per capital (GPC) is put at btw 0.5 to 1.2kg/person/day
- Atypical waste composition shows that over
 50% of the waste generated in the state is organic fractions







Introduction

- **♦** Lagos
- o Number of Communities: 2,600
- o Population Growth Rate: Btw. 6-8% (Nigeria = 2.9%)









- **♦** The beginning of Private Sector Participation
- The PSSPs involvement was as a result of irregular & erratic services of government owned agencies
- o In the early stage, neighbourhood structure determined the type of PSSPs Formal PSSPs High-income, low population density & Informal PSSPs Low-income, high population density area.
- o Pilot scheme project in 1996/1997 22 Private Sector Service Providers (PSSPs) were appointed
- o Pilot scheme marked the beginning of recognition & formalisation
- Waste Pilot Scheme Operators' Group (WAPSOG) was formed
- o Over 650 formal PSSPs operate in Lagos alone, another 550 spread across Nigeria in Abuja, Rivers, Ibadan, Ogun, Edo, Kwara states etc

♦ The origin of the Association

- o 1996/7 Pilot scheme project marked the birth of the Association
- o Formed to have a common front & to share ideas amongst operators
- No outside body was involved in its formation

♦ Membership and Organisation

- Membership is voluntary
- o Started with 22, but now over 650 members
- Headed by the Executive Council (EXCO)

♦ Financial basis

- o Obligated to pay registration fee, monthly dues & occasional levies
- o Some members are not up-to-date with their financial contributions
- o Sanctions & inducement- Ability of enjoy other benefits

- Management of Disposal sites
- Operation of MRF & TLSs in Lagos
- Waste sorting and aggregation
- Waste Recycling and Conversion


